



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

CTA By-Law Change:

The board is requesting the following by-laws change:

Amend Article V, Item D:

Secretary. The Secretary shall be responsible for keeping the official minutes of the Executive Committee meetings, the Annual Technology Summit, and other meetings of the Association and performs other duties as assigned by the President or the Executive Committee. [REMOVE: The Secretary will be responsible for the overall coordination of the association website.]

Amend Article VI, Item A:

Membership. The Executive Committee is composed of the President, Immediate Past-President, President-elect, Secretary, Treasurer, Corporate Leadership Council Past-Chair, Corporate Leadership Council Chair, Corporate Leadership Council Chair-Elect, Membership Director, <u>Marketing Director</u> and <u>Technology</u> Director. Each member of the Executive Committee will have one vote on issues affecting the Association.

Amend Article VI, Item B.6:

Appoint <u>Marketing</u> Director whose responsibility will be to promote CTA <u>using</u> <u>social media and other mechanisms to connect with correctional jurisdictions,</u> <u>educators, companies, and other participants throughout the correctional</u> <u>industry</u>. [REMOVE: at other associations, included but not limited to, American Correctional Association, American Probation and Parole Association, National Association of Justice Information Systems.] This position shall serve without compensation, but may receive reimbursement for out-of-pocket expenses incurred on behalf of the Association.


Add Article VI, Item B.8:
